

Once you've thought about the kind of graphic inquiry you'd like learners to experience, match standards with specific **assignments** and **assessments** that require deep thinking.

Design Assignments

Assignments describe the task or mission of the inquiry for the student. They also define the parameters and identify what will be valued in their work. Tools, resources, materials, learning activities, and processes are also given with the assignment. Additional scaffolding and assistance is provided as learners face obstacles or have questions.

Design Assessments

Assessment is the process of gathering, measuring, analyzing, and reporting data on a students' learning. It helps teachers determine how much children learned and how well they learned it. Assessment can also be used to determine the effectiveness of the instruction and how well students were able to meet a given standard. Interacting with students about their performance is an integral part of the learning process. There are dozens of different assessment tools that can be adapted to fit the needs of your students. These include anecdotal reports, checklists, conferencing, conversations, journals, peer assessment, portfolios, progress reports, quiz, rubrics, self assessment, scored discussion, and test.
